Investment process

An advantaged universe: Coho 250

We then employ an exclusionary overlay that removes tobacco, firearms, alcohol, defense, and mining, and implement an integrated ESG qualitative and quantitative framework.

In-depth fundamental research determines attractiveness

We execute thorough research on the investable universe and its material drivers and construct Dividend Discount Models for each company using realistic yet conservative assumptions.

Portfolio construction

Our buy/sell decisions are driven by the portfolio's risk/return profile. Both the quantitative and the qualitative processes focus on identifying and tracking the most relevant and/or material ESG factors for each industry and company.

*A Dividend Discount Model (DDM) is a procedure for valuing the price of a stock by using the predicted dividends and discounting them back to the present value.

(the "Adviser") has contractually agreed to waive its management fees and pay Fund expenses in order to ensure that Total Annual Fund Operating Expenses (excluding AFFE, leverage/borrowing interest, interest expense, dividends paid on short sales, taxes, brokerage commissions and extraordinary expenses) do not exceed 0.79% of the average daily net assets of the Fund. Fees waived and expenses paid by the Adviser may be recouped by the Adviser for a period of 36 months following the month during which such fee waiver and expense payment was made if such recoupment can be achieved without exceeding the expense limit in effect at the time the fee waiver and expense payment occurred and the expense limit in place at the time of recoupment. The Operating Expenses Limitation Agreement is indefinite in term, but cannot be terminated through at least November 29, 2021. Thereafter, the agreement may be terminated at any time upon 60 days' written notice by the Trust's Board of Trustees or the Adviser, with the consent of the Board.

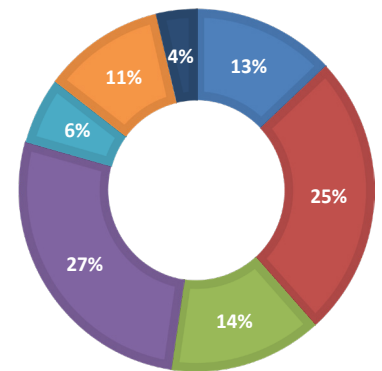
